Breast cancer is the most common cancer among Native women and is the second leading cause of cancer death. However, all bodies have breast tissue and are at risk of developing breast cancer. Indigenous Pink is a national breast cancer awareness campaign for Native people that occurs in October during National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

1 in 8 native women will get breast cancer in their lifetime. Increased Risks: Being female, Genetics, Family history, Ageing, Breast Density. Breast cancer usually has no symptoms when the tumor is small and most treatable. Annual screening begins at age 40 years old. Talk to your health care provider about when screening is best for you.
