New Naloxone Vending Machine— A Timeline

On December 1, 2025, Tsapowum Chehalis Tribe Behavioral Health installed a new naloxone vending machine at End of the Trail gas station in Grand Mound. All product is completely free and easily accessible for the community.

The machine was initially stocked with kits including four doses of naloxone, a CPR face shield, instructions on how to administer naloxone, and a fact card on how to recognize common signs of overdose.

Late December, medication disposal bags were added to the vending machine. These bags deactivate drugs or medications so that they can be safely sealed and disposed of.

In January 2026, test strip kits were added to the vending machine. These combination test strips can detect fentanyl, xylazine, and nitazene in substances of various forms such as liquids and pills. The kits include a test strip, an instruction sheet, and all materials needed to accurately complete the test.



How Much Has Been Distributed to the Community So Far?

- Naloxone: 972 boxes (1,944 individual doses)
- Fentanyl/Xylazine/Nitazene Test Strips: 176
- Drug Disposal Bags: 122

What's Next?

Another vending machine will be placed outside of the Behavioral Health building (date TBD). Along with overdose prevention tools, this machine will include additional items, such as hygiene products and other essentials.
