**Fisheries will be trapping non-native Nutria
at the Fishing Pond.**

Nutria are an invasive semi aquatic rodent species that can damage roads, levees and ponds. They have been found burrowing along the bank of the fishing pond.

Three types of traps will be used, and all traps will be flagged with pink flagging so they are identifiable. If you come across a trap avoid walking in the bushes and in the water near the flagging. These traps can cause serious harm!
