With temperatures rising and low flow conditions in the Chehalis and Black rivers on the horizon, the Chehalis Tribe's Fish & Wildlife Program is asking for the public's help to be on the lookout for dead, dying or stranded fish. Many of the pools that small fish rely on during the summer months are becoming disconnected from the main flow and stranding these fishes. Spring Chinook adults may also experience stressful conditions when the temperatures in the river rise, thus we ask to please avoid swimming in pools that adult fish are utilizing to minimize stress and allow them to complete their journey to successfully spawn.
